Congress established the Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP) in 1982 to provide services to US cities and towns that maintain over three million miles of road and 29,000 bridges.

There is an LTAP Center in every US state and Puerto Rico, and there are Regional Centers serving Tribal Governments.

The UNH T2 Center was established in 1986. We continue the LTAP mission by providing many services to NH cities and towns, the NH Department of Transportation, and private road-related organizations.

Our mission is to provide NH municipalities with technical and management information that contribute to the success of highway systems.

1 TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES. Over 40 workshops are offered annually throughout NH. Most are one-day and 5 Roads Scholar credits. Workshop examples are: *A Hard Road to Travel; Basics of a Good Road; Drainage, Drainage, Drainage; Public Relations; Culvert Installation and Maintenance; Lines, Levels, and Layouts; Reconstruction Project Planning; and Workzone Traffic Control.*

2 NH ROADS SCHOLAR PROGRAM. Includes four recognition levels, with specific subject area coverage. At each level, awards and certificates are presented; names are published in an annual Roads Scholar Directory and newsletter, with an article and portrait for Master Roads Scholars; official letters are mailed to Selectmen and Supervisors; and press releases are sent to local newspapers.

3 NEWSLETTER. *Road Business* is published quarterly and features technical articles, list of available publications, and a training calendar.

4 MUTUAL AID. A network of municipalities that agree to assist one another during public works emergencies. For information, contact kathy.desroches@unh.edu.

5 PUBLICATIONS AND VIDEOS. Over 100 publications and DVDs may be added to your library or borrowed for three weeks at no charge.

6 TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE. Personalized technical assistance is available through phone, fax, email, or walk-ins.
